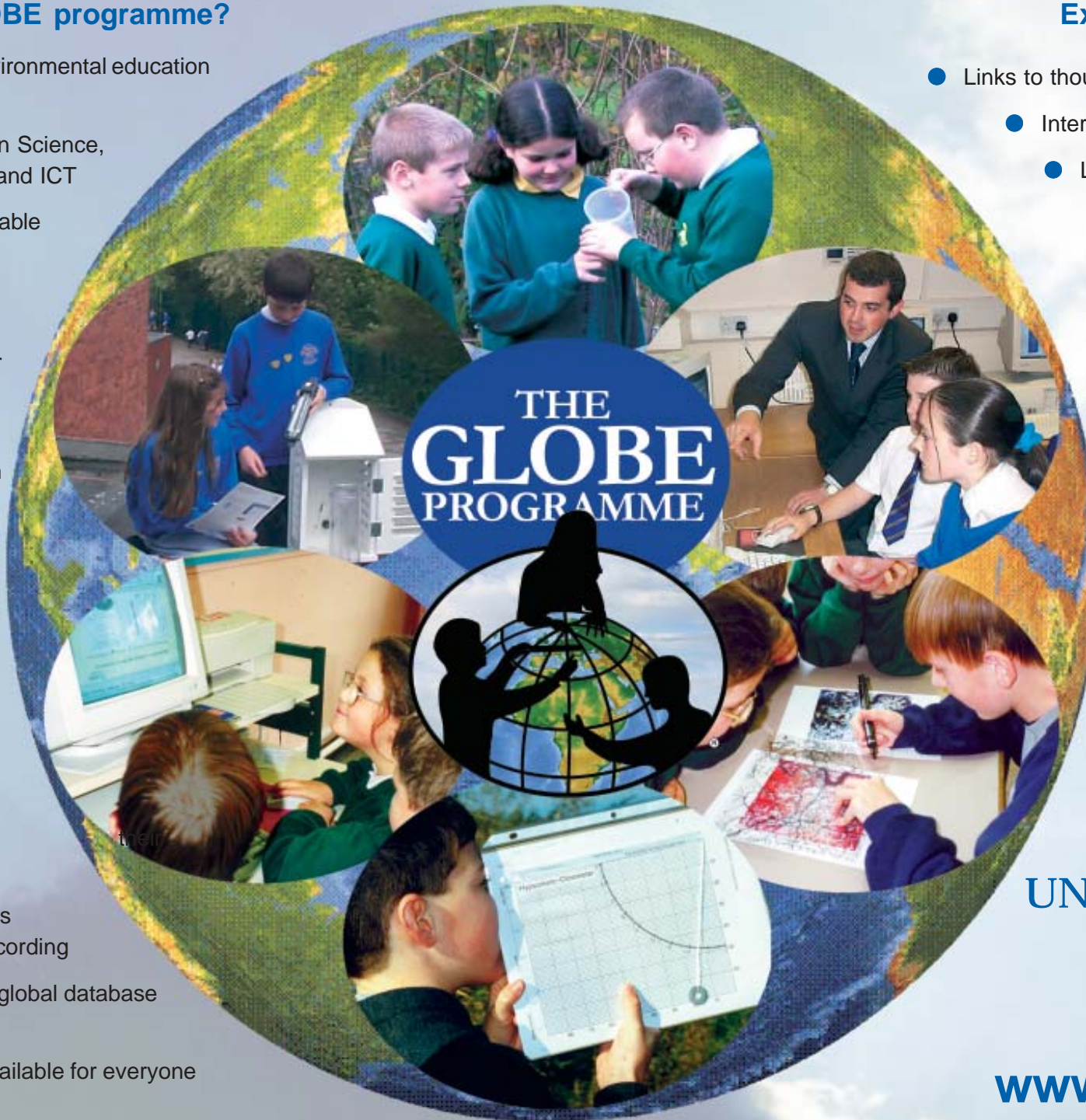


What is the GLOBE programme?
